Below is a **SAMPLE** high school curriculum for a home-schooled student in New York State based on Home-Schooling Regulations Section 100.10:

9th Grade

- English 9 (1 unit)
- World History & Geography (1 unit)
- Algebra 1 or Consumer Math (1 unit)
- Earth Science (1 unit)
- Physical Education (1/2 unit)
- Art or Music (1 unit)
 (Art and/or music may be taught once during high school, or may be spaced out as approximately 27 hours per year)
- Health (1/2 unit)
- Elective* (1 unit)

10th Grade

- English 10 (1 unit)
- World History & Geography 2 or European History (1 unit)
- Algebra 2 or Geometry (1 unit)
- Biology (1 unit)
- Physical Education (1/2 unit)
- Elective* (1 unit)

In accordance with 8 NYCRR § 100.10 Home instruction, students in grades 9 through 12 are required to take: English (four units); social studies (four units), which includes one unit of American history, one-half unit in participation in government, and one-half unit of economics; mathematics (two units); science (two units); art and/or music (one unit); health education (one-half unit); physical education (two units); and three units of electives.

Please note that this list is meant to illustrate a "**SAMPLE**" curriculum for a high school student who is being home schooled in NYS that meets the requirements of the equivalent of a four-year high school program. You are not required to take all of these exact courses or take them in this particular order. Courses that are specifically required by NYS are so indicated.

11th Grade

- English 11 (1 unit)
- American History (1 unit) This specific course is Required
- Geometry or Trigonometry (or another non-math elective) (1 unit)
- Chemistry (or another non-science elective) (1 unit)
- Physical Education (1/2 unit)
- Elective* (1 unit)

12th Grade

- English 12 (1 unit)
- Economics (1/2 unit) and participation in Government (1/2 unit) These specific courses are Required
- Trigonometry or Pre-Calculus (or another non-math elective) (1 unit)
- Physics or Anatomy & Physiology (or another non-science elective) (1 unit)
- Physical Education (1/2 unit)
- Elective* (1 unit)

^{*}Electives can be anything from another English, history, math, or science course; to other courses such as a foreign language, computers, photography, poetry, drama, music, art, culinary arts, first aid, work study, community service/volunteering, etc.; to college courses (usually for 11th or 12th graders).
